Additional Information

UTS City Campus is not located close to Sydney's beaches but is a 15 min walk from Darling Harbour. Please keep in mind if you stay closer to the beaches, you will need to travel around 20-30 mins into the city. The closest public transport stops to UTS City Campus are Central Train Station and Haymarket Light Rail Stop, as well as a number of bus stops.

Sydney's public transport system can be accessed with an Opal card or a credit/debit card that is Tap-enabled. A trip averages \$2-\$6 AUD and there is a surcharge to travel from the International Airport to Central station, costing \$19.50 AUD.

Visas

If you are not an Australian Citizen or hold an Australian Passport, in order to enter Australia, <u>you will need a visa</u>. Below is a list of options for you to apply for in advance of your visit to Australia.

These visas are for the exclusive purpose of attending the conference and not for other business, research, or study matters.
